





Elder Abuse Prevention Ontario (EAPO)

MISSION

EAPO envisions an Ontario where **ALL** seniors are free from abuse, have a strong voice, feel safe and respected.

ACTION

Building that requires raising awareness, delivering education and training, working collaboratively with likeminded organizations and assisting with service coordination and advocacy.



STOP ABUSE RESTORE RESPECT

SIMPLY PUT, WE ALL HAVE A ROLE TO PLAY

EAPO is mandated to support the implementation of Ontario's Strategy to Combat Elder Abuse.

Funded by the ON Government, under the Ministry of Seniors and Accessibility (MSAA)









COMMUNITY COORDINATION & RESPONSE

Collaborate with community agencies, elder abuse networks and provincial/national organizations.



TRAINING

Provide cross-sectoral training to front-line staff, and supports to older adults.



PUBLIC AWARENESS

Deliver presentations and develop communication tools for older adults, caregivers, family and public at large.



Is Elder Abuse a New Issue?



Elder Abuse

COVID-19 has exacerbated the VULNERABILITIES of older adults, putting them at increased risk for Abuse



Elder Abuse

"... a single, or repeated act, or lack of appropriate action, occurring within any relationship where there is an expectation of trust, which causes harm or distress to an older person."



EMOTIONAL ABUSE

Any action, verbal or non-verbal, that lessens a person's sense of identity, dignity and self-worth.



SOCIAL ISOLATION

- Prisoners in their own home
- Power imbalance: Loss of control in decision making and choices
- Denied *or* no Access to technology (computer/IPad/phone) to connect with family, friends, agencies
- Disregard for privacy Video conferencing
- Invisibility to family / community



FINANCIAL ABUSE

Any improper conduct, done with or without the informed consent of the older adult that results in a monetary or personal gain to the abuser and/or monetary or personal loss for the older adult.



HARDSHIP

- COVID Frauds and Scams
- Families/adult children moving back in with parents/grandparents, yet not financially contributing
- Lack or no access to banking information
- Misuse of Power of Attorney



NEGLECT

The failure to provide care and assistance required for health, safety or well-being, and includes inaction or a pattern of inaction that jeopardizes the health or safety of an older adult.



FAILURE TO THRIVE

- Limited access to food and medications
- Physician appointments cancelled or phone consultations
- Monitoring health conditions Increased Frailty
- Inability to 'physically' check on or observe changes in health, mental well-being of older adults



PHYSICAL ABUSE

Any act of violence or rough-handling that may or may not result in physical injury, but causes physical discomfort or pain.



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

- Escalation of emotional anger from being 'trapped' at home
- Abuse is hidden from loved ones due to 'physical distancing'
- Suffering in silence
- Challenges in how to leave and/or go to a 'Safe Space'

Risk Factors

Vulnerable Groups

- Socially Isolated
- Being a Women
- LGBTQ2S+
- Depression
- Previous abuse as a child, youth or adult
- Dementia/Cognitive Impairment
- Living with someone who is dependent
- Addictions
- Deteriorating health situations where one partner cares for the other

I may be isolated because of my culture or language.

Removed from Engagement

- Isolation from family and friends
- Health care and support services limited or not available
- Phone and/or technology not available/taken away
- Decisions made without asking
- Threats of violence or abandonment
- Access to mail withheld
